The students are continuing to review letters and numbers. They are also writing and spelling some sight words.

In phonics, we review double consonants and digraphs. The sight words are all sent home. Please continue to work on them!

In SEL (Social Emotional Learning) we talked about playing fair. We reviewed the problem solving steps and how to share, take turns, and go to another game. We are really working on not tattling and solving problems without the help of an adult.

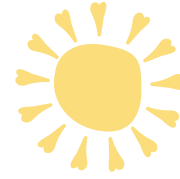

In writing we wrote a book about pets. The students got to choose a pet and give 3 reasons why they liked it! The books came home with them.
